### German Studies

This is a transnational and interdisciplinary major that encompasses the various German-speaking regions of central Europe and offers an intellectually diverse program—which can include literature, history, politics, arts, philosophy, and business. Currently, Germany is a leading trade partner and ally of the U.S. and is a linchpin in the European Union. The cultural and linguistic traditions of Austria and Switzerland enrich the field of German Studies.

Acquiring proficiency in the German language is an integral part of German Studies at all levels.

German Studies majors are strongly encouraged to complete a pre-approved study, internship, or work experience of one to two semesters in a German-speaking country, or in an approved immersion program. NMU's exchange partner in Germany, Oldenburg University, offers excellent support services at an affordable cost. Elective courses toward the major may be taken abroad and may substitute for the electives with departmental approval.

# Skills and Competencies

The multinational tech firm Google surveyed its work force and many of the top characteristics of Google

employees are skills acquired in the German language, literature, and culture classrooms. Those abilities include:

- 1. Being a good coach, having empathy, and being supportive.
- 2. Communicating and listening well.
- 3. Possessing insights into others (including others' different values and points of view).
- 4. Being a good critical thinker and problem solver.
- 5. Being able to make connections across complex ideas.

The German Studies Program emphasizes aptitude in cultural diversity, communication, critical thinking, reading, and writing, thus providing students with marketable and practical skills regardless of their career path. Students learn to gauge nuanced cultural differences and to communicate effectively with people of different backgrounds, making them ready to navigate today's diverse professional environment. Students develop critical thinking, leading them to approach difficult and abstract challenges with creativity and confidence. While studying German language, literatures, and cultures, students learn about international customs, gestures, attitudes, politics, history, world views, and artistic contributions of Germans and German-speaking peoples around the globe.

### Career Development

You should begin the resume-building process as soon as you can. The Academic and Career Advisement Center can assist you with career planning, while Career Services will help you fine tune your resume. In the meantime, we highly recommend that you study abroad. A study abroad experience stands out to future employers because it demostrates your adaptability and ability to engage with people from diverse backgrounds. Obtaining a professionally related internship, membership in the German Club (and/or serving as an officer of the club), and work as a German tutor in the Language Resource are ways to develop your skills and gain experience, and enhance your resume. Your academic course work is important as well, so be sure to maintain a high grade point average.

## Additional Considerations

Many German Studies majors also double-major. Some popular major pairings include Public Relations and Communications (especially for students interested in graduate school or marketing), Mechanical Engineering (especially for students interested in working in the auto industry), International Studies (especially for students who plan to study abroad in a German-speaking country), Biology, and Environmental Studies, just to name a few.
