In the Department of Theatre and Dance, theatre technology is one of the fastest growing areas and is in high demand. During your time of study, you will learn both in the classroom and in a practical setting, working both backstage as well as on stage. At NMU, we pride ourselves on developing students into designers and technologists, where they are the frontrunners of making our departmental productions come to life. During your time at NMU, you will have the opportunity to work in our state of the art, 500 seat proscenium theatre, the Forest Roberts, as well as our Panowski Black Box that reflects many professional theatres across the country. We at the Department of Theatre and Dance believe that as a pre-professional training program, it is our responsibility to ensure that students' opportunities reflect what they will be getting once they enter the professional world. If you are interested in exploring technology for theatre and discovering all of the avenues that it can open for you in the world of theatre, television, and film, then the Theatre Technology degree within NMU's Department of Theatre and Dance is the perfect program for you!

Skills and Competencies

NMU's Department of Theatre and Dance strives to create a learning environment where students excel both academically and professionally. Additional Considerations

The BFA in Theatre Technology and Design is a highly specialized and sought after program of study. This degree offers 6 different areas of study - Scenery, Costumes, Lighting, Sound and Media, Stage Management, and Technical Direction. In most cases, students will be admitted into the program in their freshman year, but students may also audition for the BFA program in any year of study if they choose to do so. Admittance into the BFA program requires an interview and portfolio submission.
