HOW TO APPLY

1. Complete this Application Form.

Or for faster processing, submit our online form at nmu.edu/apply.

2. Submit the Application Fee.

Submit the \$35 non-refundable application processing fee in one of these ways:

- ▶ By credit card at nmu.edu/appfee
- ▶ By credit card via phone at 906-227-2650 or 800-682-9797
- ▶ By check or money order made payable to NMU; please include the applicant's name on the check
- ▶ By cash at the Admissions Office, 2212 Hedgcock Building.

If you wish to enroll in a future term, you may apply your paid fee to any term occurring within two calendar years of your initial application term. In cases of financial hardship, a fee waiver request may be made. NMU considers requests made via standard fee waiver request forms such as College Board, NACAC, or high school forms verifying financial status. Submit via mail or fax (906-227-1747).

You do not have to pay the fee if you:

- ▶ Qualify for the senior citizen tuition waiver (age 62 or older)
- ▶ Are a U.S. military veteran or active

duty service member

- ▶ Previously attended NMU at the same level to which you are applying (fee paid once pre-baccalaureate and once post-baccalaureate/graduate).

3. Submit Your Official Transcripts.*

- ▶ High school transcript or high school equivalency (GED, HiSET, TASC, etc)
- ▶ All post-secondary transcripts – You must have official transcripts submitted directly from all institutions attended even if no credits were earned.
- ▶ Military transcripts – Discretionary; please contact our office for information.

***You do not have to submit transcripts if you are:**

- ▶ a non-degree applicant
- ▶ a transfer applicant who has earned more than 12 college-level credits after high school
- ▶ a postbaccalaureate applicant.

4. Optional: Submit Your Test Scores.

ACT or SAT scores are not required for students applying for 2021. Although NMU will not consider SAT/ACT scores for admission, they can be submitted for scholarship consideration. Students

who will submit their ACT or SAT should request their scores be sent to NMU. If you listed NMU when you registered for the test, the testing agency will send the results to us. The scores may also be on your official high school transcript, which will suffice. Otherwise, submit an online request at act.org or sat.org. NMU's ACT code is 2038; the SAT Code is 1560.

NMU will accept either the ACT or SAT results and will always consider the highest ACT composite or SAT total score from a single test date for admission and scholarship purposes if a student submits multiple test results. Writing scores are not considered.

Home-Schooled Applicants.

Students who have been homeschooled at any time during grades 9–12, and have not taken 12 or more college-level credits after completion of high school, should submit an official and notarized transcript of courses taken and grades earned while homeschooled.
