#### Is this the right application for you?

Yes, if you are a:

Degree-seeking new first-year student -Attending college for the first time after completing high school (including students who have taken college courses while in high school).

Degree-seeking new transfer student -Enrolled at a college or university after high school completion but did not earn a baccalaureate degree.

#### Post-baccalaureate student -

Completed a baccalaureate degree and desire to earn a second undergraduate degree in a different field or seek an elementary or secondary provisional teaching certificate.

Non-degree student - Interested in taking undergraduate courses for personal or professional development after completion of high school/GED or higher, but do not plan to seek a certificate or degree at this time.

Returning (re-entry) student -Previously taken courses at NMU, not completed a baccalaureate degree and not attended for over one year.

No, if you are a:

Guest student, graduate student, international student, or a high school student wishing to take NMU courses under dual enrollment/concurrent enrollment/middle college.

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

Applying to NMU is easy. We will review your academic transcripts as they relate to the program you want to study. No test scores (ACT/SAT) should be submitted. Just follow the 3 steps below, and once we have received them all, you'll hear from us within two weeks.

#### 1. COMPLETE THIS APPLICATION FORM. Or for faster processing, submit our online form at nmu.edu/apply.

#### 2. SUBMIT THE APPLICATION FEE.

Fee waivers may be granted in cases of financial hardship. For consideration, submit the NMU form (nmu.edu/admissions/ feewaivers) via e-mail (admissions@nmu. edu), fax (906–227–1747) or mail (address above). Fee waiver forms provided by high schools, TRIO programs, the College Board, or NACAC may also be submitted.

### You do not have to pay the fee if you:

- ▶ Qualify for the senior citizen tuition waiver (age 62 or older)
- ▶ Are a U.S. military veteran or active duty service member

▶ Previously attended NMU at the same level to which you are applying (fee is paid once pre-baccalaureate and once post-baccalaureate/graduate).

#### 3. SUBMIT YOUR OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS.

Official transcripts are those sent directly to NMU by the issuing school, college or agency. They can be mailed or transmitted through a secure transcript service the school may use (such as Naviance, Parchment, eScript and others). Transcripts sent as e-mail attachments are not considered official.

We will review your transcripts in order to make an admission decision, even if you will be completing additional courses prior to your enrollment at NMU. You must request a final complete transcript to be sent prior to starting classes at NMU. Be sure to list all schools and colleges attended on the application for admission.

What transcripts should you request? See definitions in gray box above and then find your requirements below.

#### First-year applicants:

- ▶ High school transcript or high school equivalency results (GED, HiSET, TASC, etc.)
- ▶ College/university transcripts for dual enrollment or early/middle college credits
- these are not required for an admission decision but will be used to award credits for your NMU degree program.
- ▶ AP. IB. CLEP exam results directly from the test agency- these are not required for an admission decision, but will be used

to award credits for your NMU degree program.

#### **Transfer applicants:**

- ▶ College/university transcripts from all colleges attended, even if no credits were
- ▶ AP, IB, CLEP exam results directly from the test agency - these are not required for an admission decision, but will be used to award credits for your NMU degree program.
- ▶ High school transcript or high school equivalency results (GED, etc.) in these
  - You completed less than 12 college level credits after high school graduation.
  - You will be seeking State of Michigan financial aid grants.

#### Post-baccalaureate applicants:

- ► College/university transcripts from all colleges attended, even if no credits were
  - Contact our office if your baccalaureate degree is not yet reflected on your transcript.

#### Returning (re-entry) applicants:

► College/university transcripts from colleges attended since your last NMU enrollment.

#### Non-degree applicants:

▶ No transcripts required.

#### Military and Home School:

- ▶ Military transcripts are discretionary. Please contact the Admissions Office.
- ▶ Homeschool high school transcripts may be agency or home educator-produced; see nmu.edu/homeschool for details.
