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Article I Agreement on Principle

Northern Michigan University (NMU) and Oakton College (hereinafter referred to as Oakton) agree that students who choose to transfer from a community college to a senior college or university to earn a bachelor's degree should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, NMU and Oakton agree to enter into this curriculum articulation agreement for students who complete the A.G.S. Degree with Cannabis Dispensary and Patient Care Certificate at Oakton and transfer to NMU to complete the Bachelor of Science in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial Track). Both institutions enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

Article II Agreement on Program Specifics

NMU and Oakton agree that any student who has successfully completes the minimum requirements as outlined in the attached articulation guide may transfer the course credits indicated toward the Bachelor of Science in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial Track) at NMU. Students who follow this articulated program agreement must apply and be admitted to NMU. Oakton Students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid. The bachelor's degree graduation requirements for students who follow this articulated program agreement are listed on the attached articulation guide.

Article III Agreement on Communication

NMU and **Oakton** agree to cooperate in communication with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to current and prospective students.

Article IV Agreement on Maintenance and Review Procedures

At least one administrative or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as agents for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions and to communicate changes to respective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Department Chairperson of Cannabis Studies at Oakton, Assistant Vice President of Academic Affairs and College Transitions and the Associate Provost for Academic Affairs at Northern Michigan University

Both parties agree to communicate annually any changes in their respective programs that may affect this articulation agreement. During the third year, both parties will review the agreement for revision and possible renewal. If the agreement is not reviewed by the end of the effective agreement, **Oakton** students who started the articulated program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given three additional years to be admitted to **NMU** under terms of this agreement.

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Effective Dates of this Articulation Agreement July 1 2024 - July 1, 2027

Introduction

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide a smooth transition for students who want to earn an **A.G.S.** degree with Cannabis Dispensary and Patient Care Specialist Certificate at Oakton and transfer to NMU to complete a **B.S.** degree in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial Track). As displayed in this document, the first and second years of coursework are completed at Oakton; the third and fourth years at NMU.

The Medicinal Plant Chemistry degree is an interdisciplinary program that builds on foundational chemistry and biology courses and provides students with a two-semester capstone research experience involving the cultivation of plants followed by extraction and analysis of medicinal compounds from the plants. The entrepreneurial track combines the science core with business courses to help prepare students for involvement in a business related to plant medicinal products.

Effective Dates

The effective dates of this agreement are from **July 1, 2024 - July 1, 2027**. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who have already started this articulated program at **Oakton** will be given three additional years to be admitted to **NMU** under the terms of this agreement. Students, who began the program prior to the effective date may use the agreement to the extent that the requirements completed are consistent with this agreement.

Year One & Two at Oakton

Completion of the **A.G.S** degree with Cannabis Dispensary and Patient Care Certificate at Oakton is equivalent to the first two years of the **B.S.** degree in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial Track) at NMU. The following chart outlines courses for the **A.G.S** degree with Cannabis Dispensary and Patient Care Certificate at Oakton, containing restricted selections to meet requirements within the General Education Program at NMU:

^{*}CNB 102 will count towards the major courses due to the one credit transfer deficiency from CHM 122 transferring to NMU for four credits. Although CHM 121 also transfers to NMU with four credits, this deficiency will not create a major equivalency shortage due to CNB 103 transferring to NMU with two credits.

A maximum of 90 semester credits may transfer to NMU from a two-year college. Unless otherwise designated, a grade of C- or higher is required for transfer to NMU.

Year Three & Four at Northern Michigan University (NMU)

The third and fourth years of the **B.S degree in Medicinal Plant Chemistry (Entrepreneurial Track)** at **NMU** are comprised of **55-59** credits. To qualify for a bachelor's degree at **NMU**, students must meet all graduation requirements, which include the courses listed below.

- 4. NMU's General Education Program and all graduation requirements must be completed by the student, including the World Cultures requirement, Laboratory Science requirement, and Math and English Competency requirement.
