Meeting Minutes**

**Call To Order**

**I. Roll Call**

- A. Voice Johnson calls the meeting to order at 9:01 pm
- B. Elizabeth Planica, Ben Trevillian, Mikayla Christenson, and Seanna Stine are absent and excused.

**II. Public Comment**

- A. Alex, member of Sustainability Advisory Council and president of Move NMU would like to introduce ASNMU to his new student organization
  - 1. Move NMU is a new student org with a focus on raising awareness for sustainable transportation options around campus
    - a) e.g. walking, biking, public transportation
  - 2. They often do tablings in Jamrich, partner with other student organizations, and hand out Marq-Tran public transit brochures
    - a) Marq-Tran is the city of Marquette's public transit that has stops on campus twice an hour
  - 3. Alex shares a personal experience he had while biking to class at the Jacobetti Complex
    - a) Was struck by a car at the roundabout on Wright Street near the EZ Stop
    - b) He ended up physically okay but is still shaken up and hesitant to get on his bike again
  - 4. Move NMU wants to push NMU to do better at building infrastructure for biking and walking around campus
  - 5. External Affairs Director Allen thanks Alex for coming to the meeting and sharing his experience, and suggests that Parking Committee talk to Mike



- Bath about infrastructure and making crosswalks safer
6. Public Relations Director Joseph reminds everyone of Bike Share program and mentions that it has kind of fallen off since the move from Gries Hall
    - a) Students can use bikes from the Outdoor Recreation Center during the winter
  7. Director Joseph thinks it would be a good idea for ASNMU to partner with Move NMU to provide visibility products like reflective vests for students walking and biking around campus
  8. President Gibson mentions that Student Affairs is working on a ride share program and that the Break Bus was an option previously
  9. Academic Affairs Chair Brock expresses his support for Director Allen and Director Joseph's ideas and suggests that External Affairs contact the Marquette County Road Commission about Alex's incident and work with them on making the roundabout safer
  10. Student Affairs Chair Belcher asks Alex to speak with him after the meeting
  11. Dana Hinckley asks President Gibson about what is going on with Bike Share
    - a) President Gibson informs everyone that bikes can be rented out by students through the ORC and through the Fit Zone
      - (1) Fit Zone rentals can be checked out for up to 24 hours and rented out during Fit Zone's hours
