The Impact of \$22,000 in Programming Expenses:

EcoReps repaired **60** clothing and gear items at our Fix It Friday events.

We repaired over **100** bikes at our Tune Up Tuesday events.


11 workshops taught **120** students and community members about the three pillars of sustainability.

At our two zero-waste games, we diverted upwards of **93% of waste** from the landfill at each game and interacted with
approximately **3,500** people per game.



In total, we interacted with 5,000+ campus and community members representing NMU and our core values of environment, community, connection, and innovation.

The Future: The Green Fund Fee



The Green Fund fee is a \$5 opt-out fee assessed on the students. It passed the student referenda with record-high voter turnout with 76% approval rate in April of 2018. That funding would be allocated to the EcoReps to promote sustainability at Northern through the programming and internal grant opportunities. Students, faculty, and staff would be able to apply for funding to launch sustainability initiatives at Northern.
