FY2024-2025 State Budget Proposals

State Budget Factors: Base appropriation + ITW	State Budget	Tuition Restraint Language
Executive Budget	2.5% (\$1.4 million)	5.0% (\$342 per sem.) or hard dollar cap of \$390.50 per sem.
House Budget	3.3% (\$1.8 million)	4.5% (\$308 per sem.) or hard dollar cap of \$351.50 per sem.
Senate Budget	2.5% (\$1.4 million)	4.5% (\$308 per sem.) or hard dollar cap of \$351.50 per sem.

For planning purposes, we are currently using:

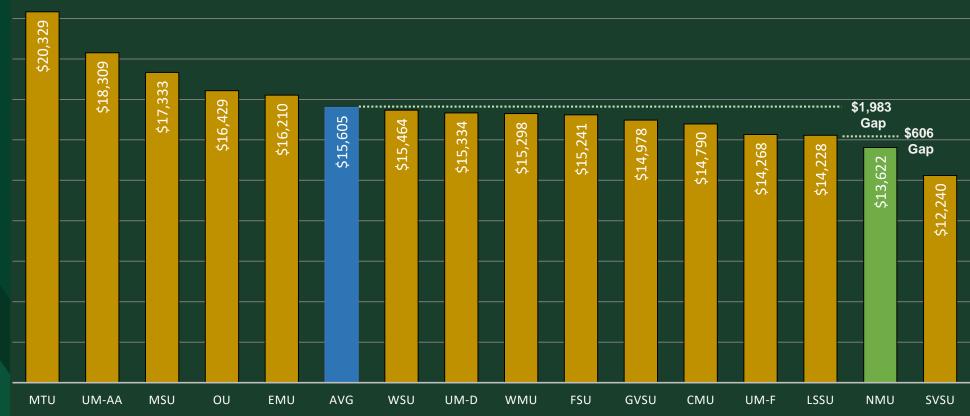
• Executive Budget for operations increase and the House/Senate tuition restraint language

Conference Committee:

Strategic Budget Goals – FY2024-2025

- Maintain competitive tuition and fees (currently 2nd lowest in the state)
- Investments in faculty and staff
- Removing barriers to student access
- Increases in supplies, materials and equipment
- Investments in university infrastructure
- Maintain financial sustainability and strength of the university



Projected University Investments and Cost Increases – FY2024-2025

- Investments in faculty and staff:
 - Significant investment in faculty from AAUP MOU
 - Annual contractual increases
 - Investment in new positions
 - Projected healthcare cost increases
- Removing barriers to student access:
 - · Investments in NMU Tuition Advantage, Bridge Award, and need-based funding
 - Elimination of undergraduate application fee
- Increases in supplies, materials and equipment:
 - Increase in lab and classroom supplies
 - Inflationary cost adjustments for software, supplies, and travel
- Investments in university infrastructure:
 - Increase in debt service for new academic facilities
- Projected net expenditure budget impact: \$6.0M



Recommended FY2024-2025 Undergraduate Tuition and Fee Rate Adjustment

Recommended Adjustment:

FY2024-25 Average Resident Undergraduate Tuition and Fee Rate Increase

\$351 per semester

Recommended Tuition and Fee Rate:

FY2024-25 Average Resident Undergraduate Tuition and Fees after Adjustment

\$7,197 per semester

Should the tuition cap be lowered in the final FY2024-25 State Budget, it is also recommended that the Board authorizes the administration to adjust tuition and fees accordingly to remain in compliance.



Recommended FY2024-2025 Detailed Tuition and Fee Rates

Proposed undergraduate tuition rate increase

- Resident and nonresident lower division rate increases by \$330 per semester
- Resident and nonresident upper division rate increases by \$342 per semester

Other proposed rate changes

- · Extension/online undergraduate increases are the same as on-campus
- · Graduate tuition increases by \$34 per credit
- Student athletic fee (one-time fee) increase of \$12
- Student activity fee increase of \$13.88 per semester (recommended increase voted on by students in Winter 2024 semester)
- Student recreational pass fee (refundable) increase of \$3 per semester
- · Differential tuition increases:
 - · Art & Design, Natural Sciences, and TOS: \$1 per credit
 - · Business, Clinical Lab Sciences, Music, and Nursing: \$2 per credit
