Library & Archives Vision:

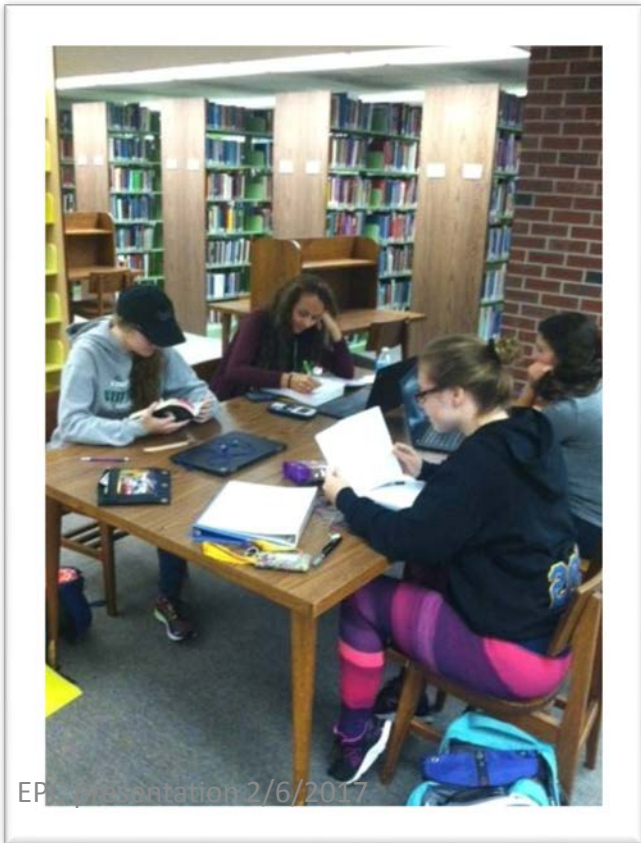
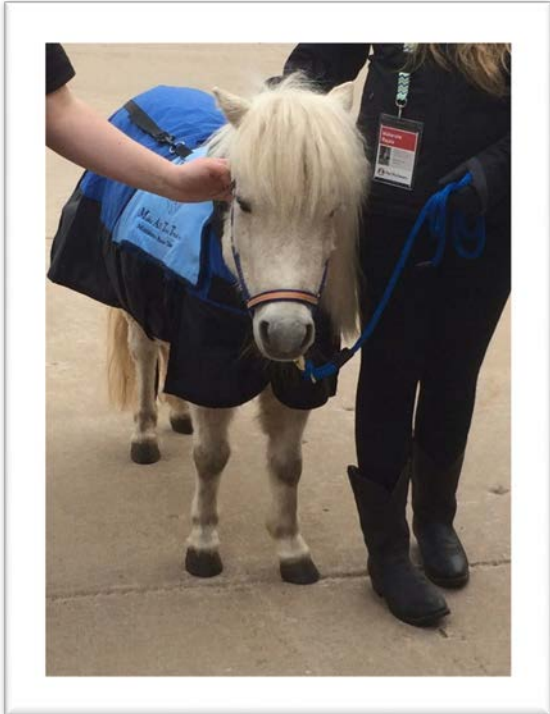
The Lydia M. Olson Library and Central Upper Peninsula Archives will be an intellectual hub enriching scholarship, creativity, diversity, and community.

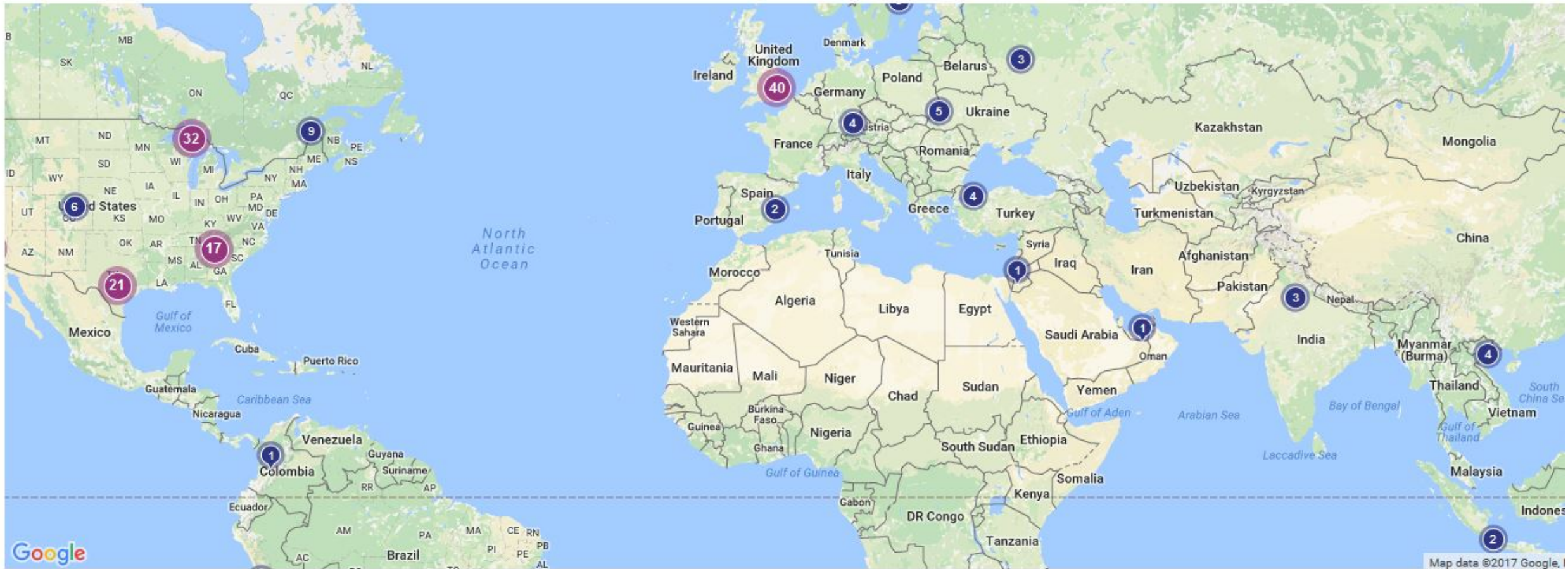

Conspectus Borealis access (Jan. 1- Jan. 31, 2017)

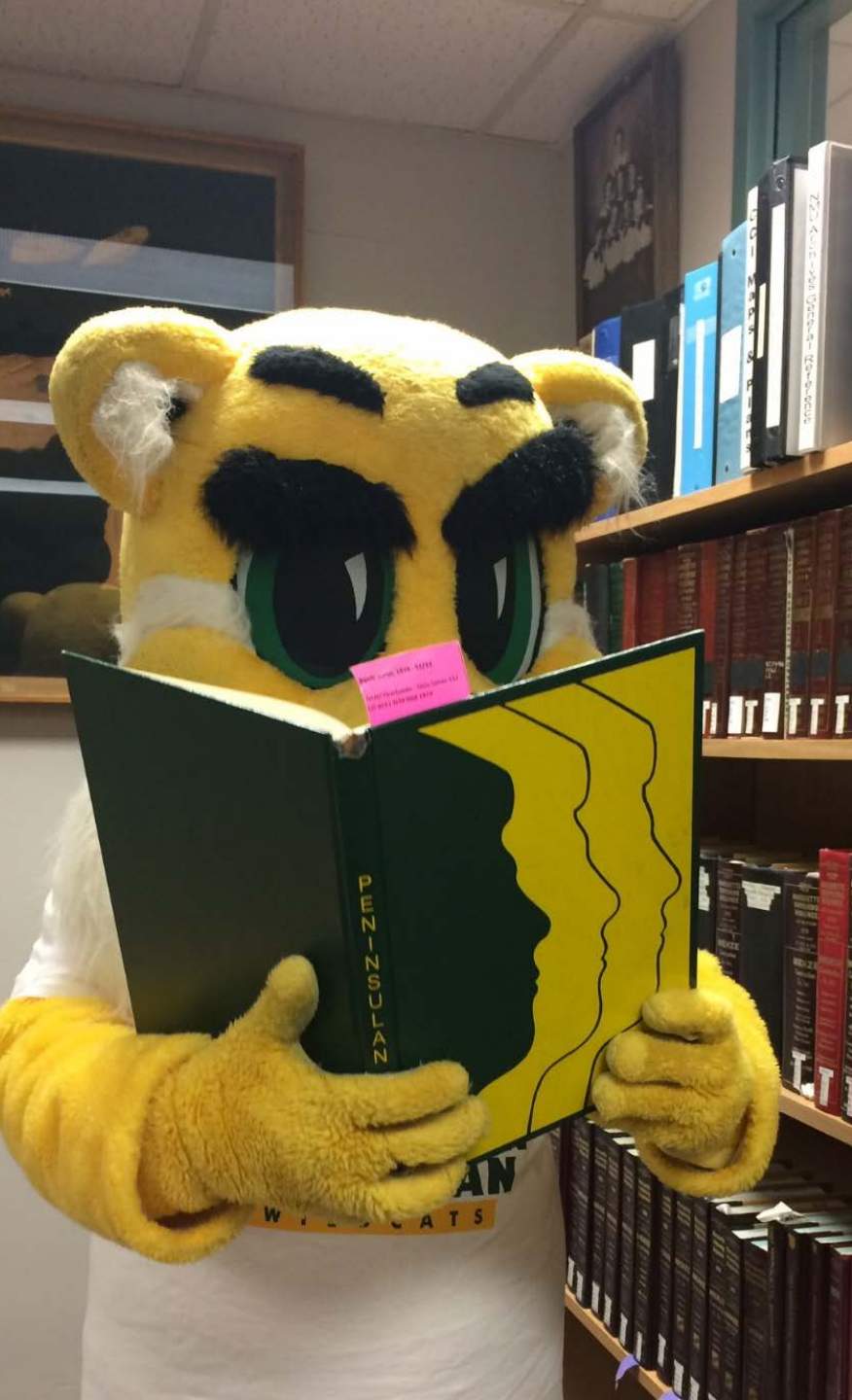
