What is an Action Project?

- A key mechanism that an institution can use to improve performance
- Projects can develop from Higher Learning Commission feedback as well as campus faculty and staff
- All AQIP campuses must have at least three current Action Projects in place (one focusing on student learning)
- Action Project information is shared publicly
- Campuses communicate with AQIP regarding the progress of each project
- Project details are included in our Systems Portfolio

NMU Action Project: Revision of General Education Learning Outcomes and Assessment

- Launch date: December 1, 2012
- Target completion date: June 30, 2014
- Goal: "The intent of this project is to review and reframe the general education **learning outcomes**, adopt or develop assessment methods and create a new process and procedure for conducting the **assessment of those learning outcomes** and using the results. This Action Project does not include review or revision of existing general education divisions." - AQIP Action Project Declaration

Communication with AQIP

- Project Declaration includes the following:
- Motivation for taking on the project
 - Areas of campus most affected by the project
 - Key processes that the project will change or improve
 - Rationale for the length of time
 - Description of how NMU will publish and monitor its efforts
 - Measures that will determine if the project has been a success or failure
