BCSSE Scales and their constituent items offer valuable information about distinct aspects of student engagement. For example, with BCSSE and NSSE data you can compare student expectations for peer collaboration to their actual collaboration several months later. 













Entering Students and the COVID-19 Disruption Additional Items on the BCSSE 2021 and 2022 Web Version




With regard to online and in-person courses, which of the following statements is most true for you?
