BCSSE Scales Snapshot

BCSSE Scales and their constituent items offer valuable information about distinct aspects of student engagement. 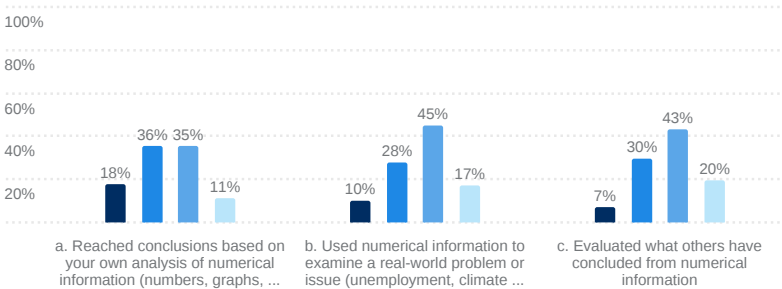
Results by Institution Characteristics

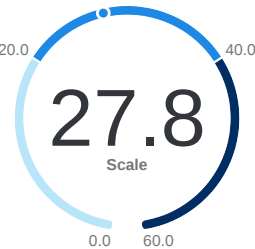

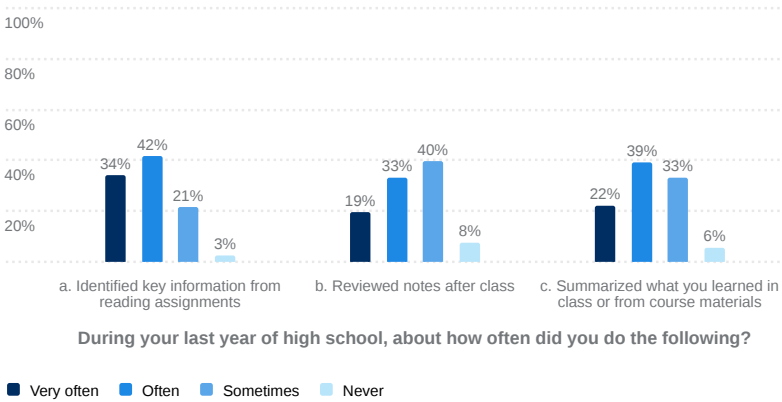

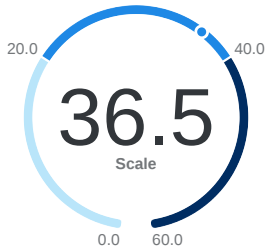

High School Engagement in Learning Strategies 1,314

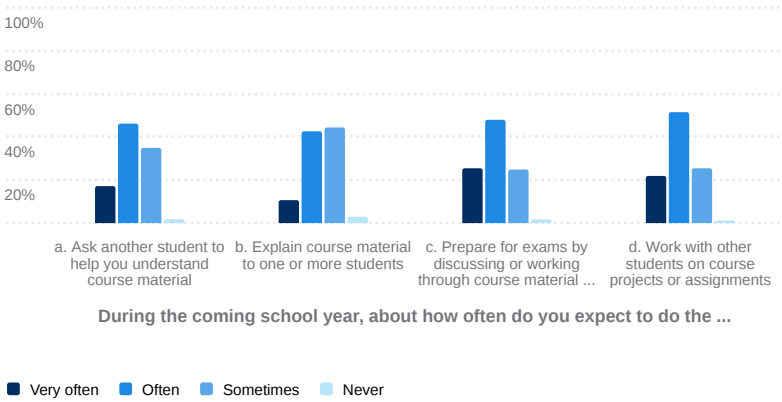

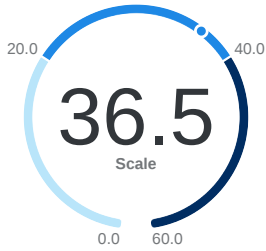

Expected Engagement in Collaborative Learning 1,295

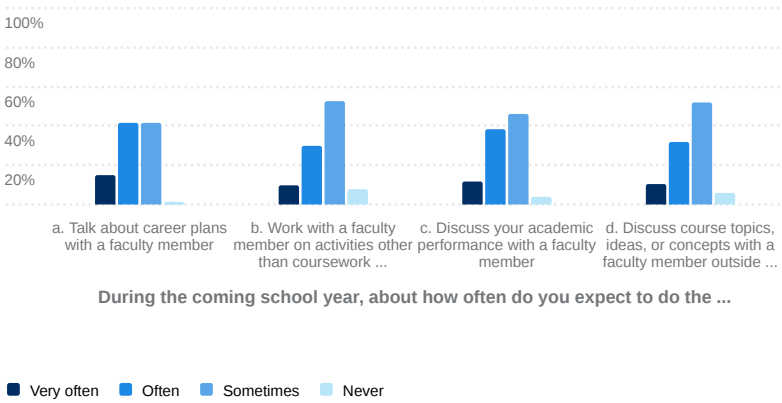

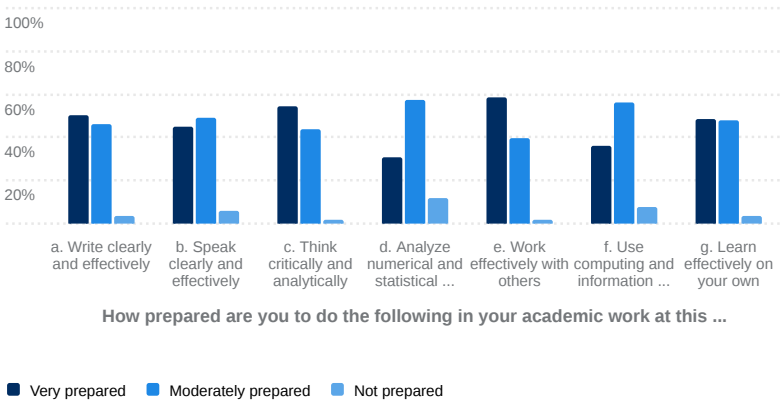

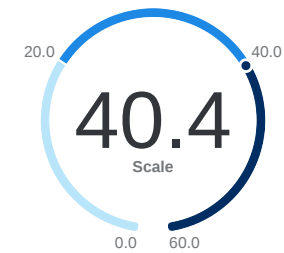

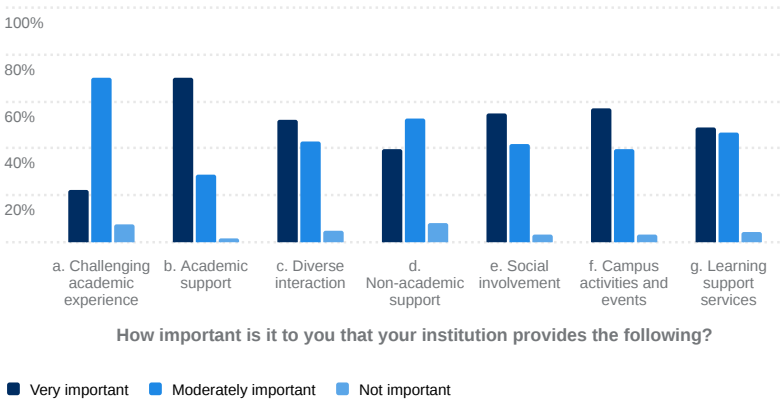

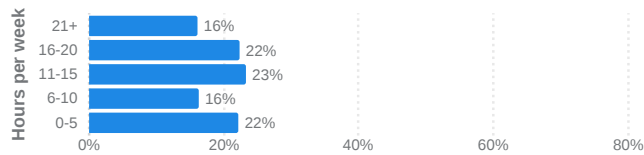

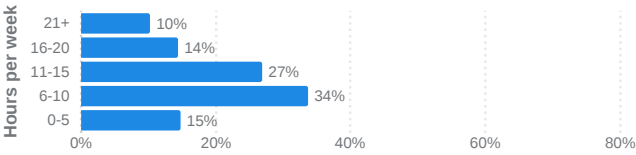

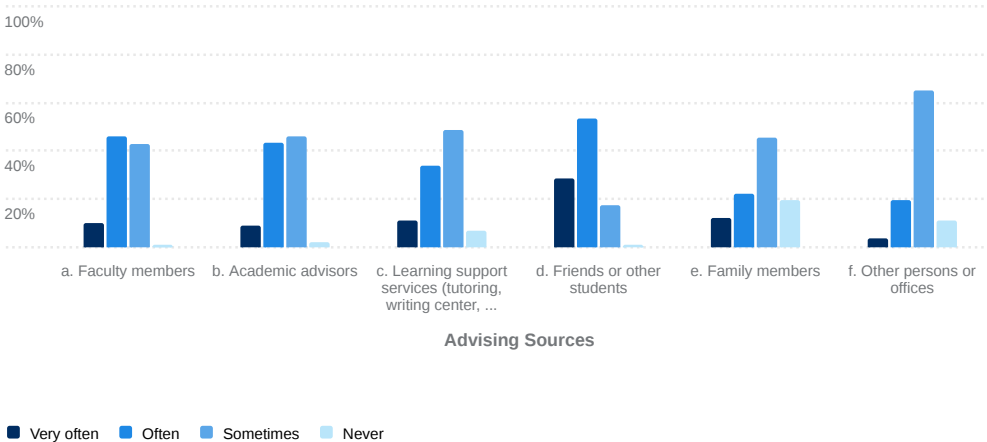
Where First-Year Students Expect to Seek Help

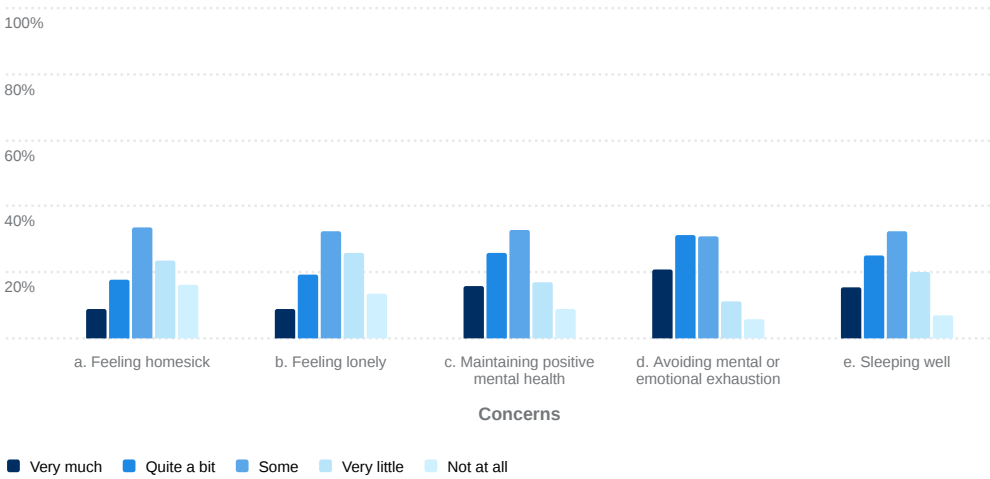

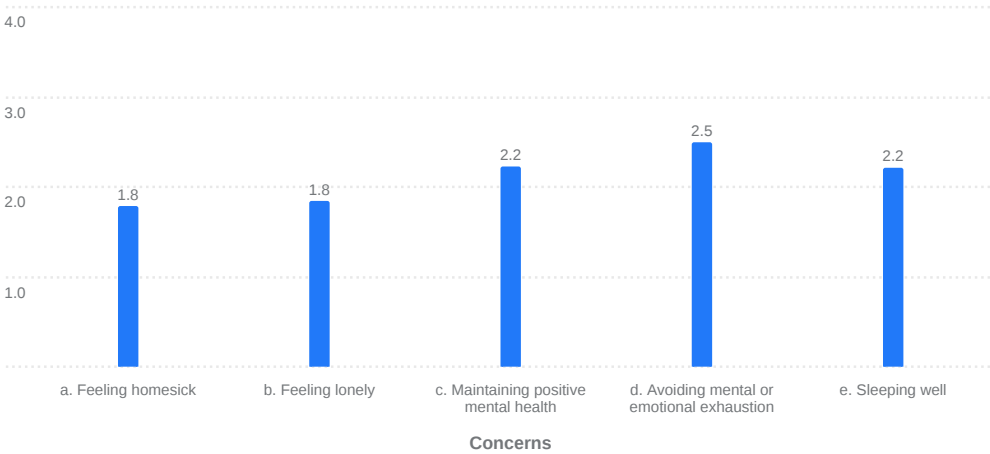

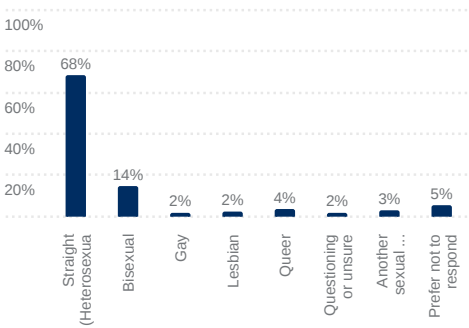
Demographic and Background Characteristics of First-Year Student Dependents



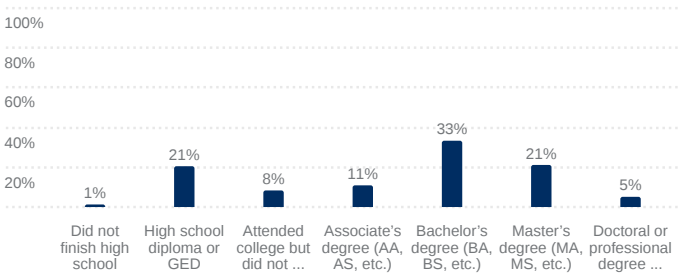

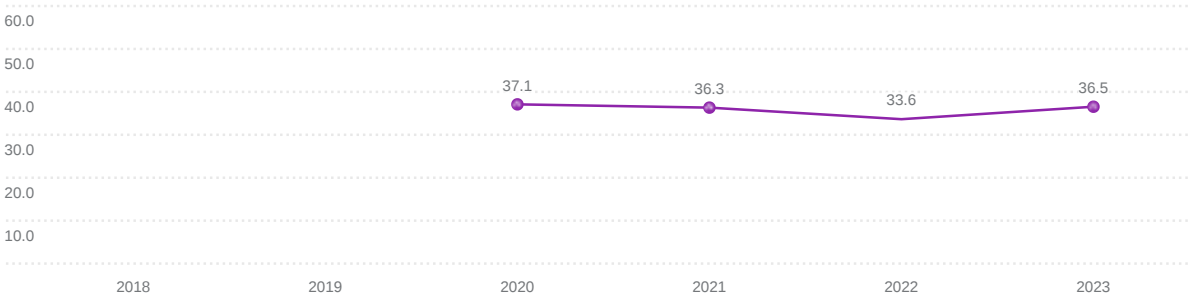

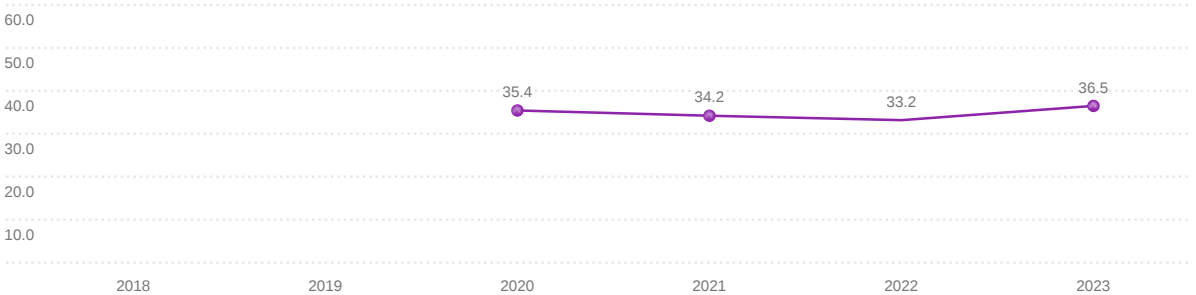

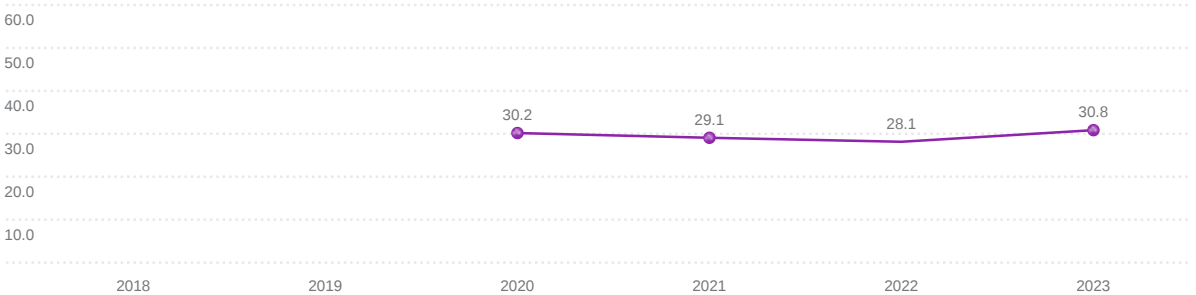

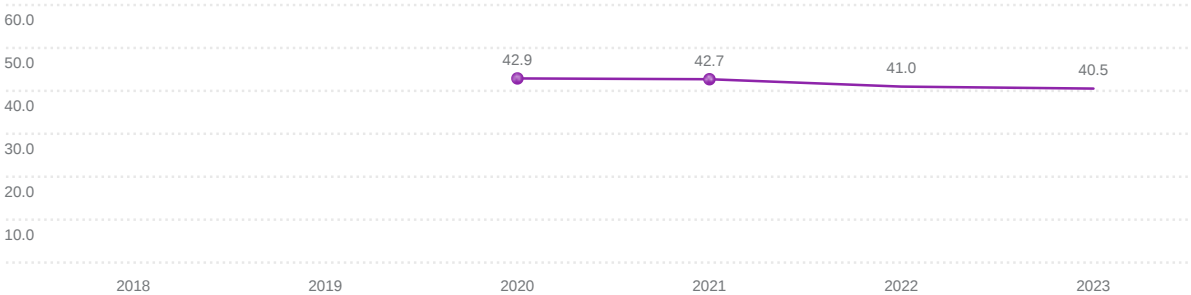

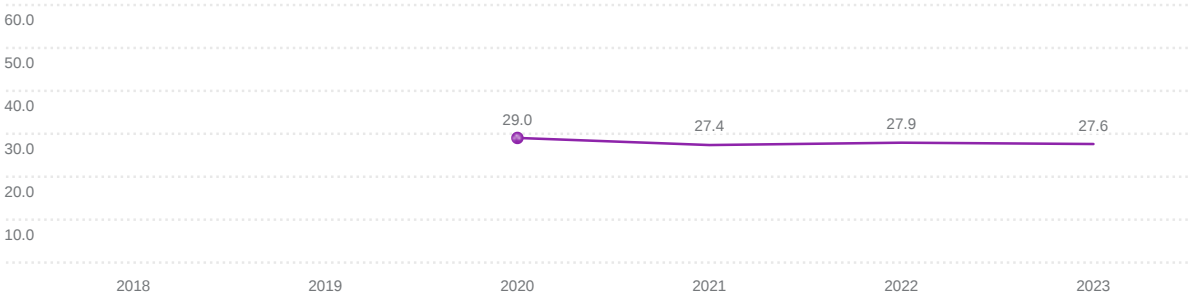

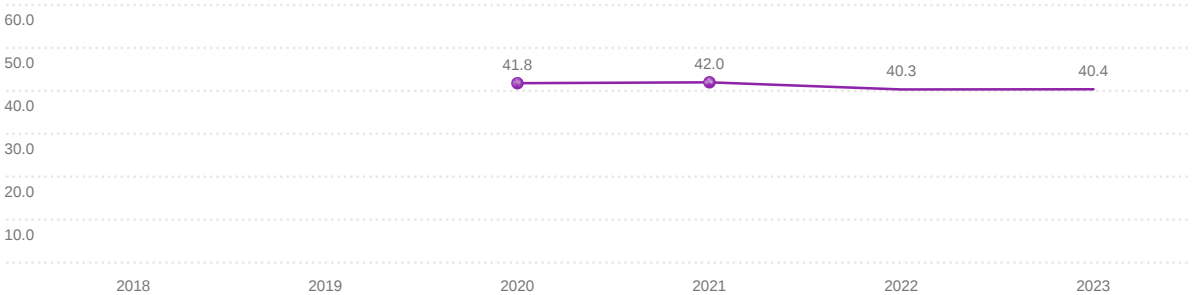

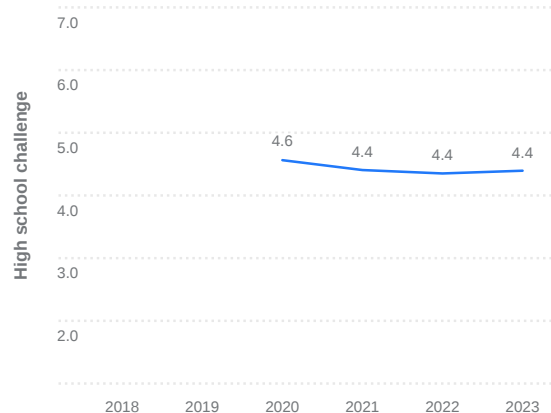

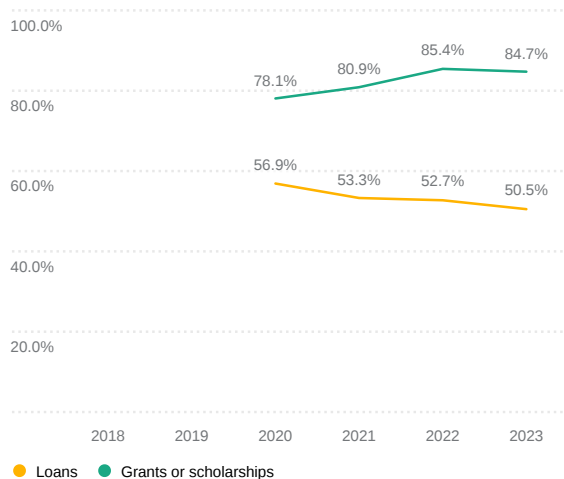


During your last year of high school, to what extent did your courses challenge you to do your best work? ⓘ

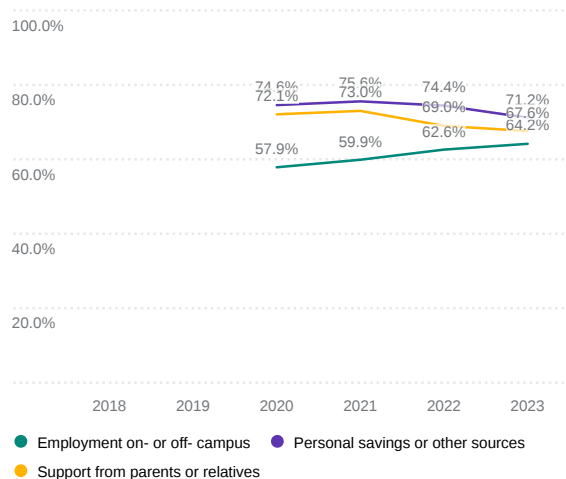
