Results Summary for SAM

- 44% (n=440) of First-Time Full-Time students who started in the Fall of 2016 successfully received a degree (bachelor, associate, or certificate) either from Northern Michigan University or another institution within 4 years;
- 60% (n=600) of this 2016 cohort received a degree from NMU within 6 years; But if we track student movement across postsecondary institutions, 72% (n=719) of them earned a degree or certificate within 6 years, either from NMU or another institution.

When zooming in to subgroups, 50% (n=10) of students receiving veteran's benefits earned a degree or certificate within 6 years, either from NMU or another institution, and this percentage for Pell grant recipients is 62% (n=162), and for students of color is 59% (n=53).

- Only 3% (n=30) of this 2016 cohort were still enrolled at NMU after 6 years from 2016.
- For Full-Time Transfer students who started in Fall 2016, 76% (n=250) of them received a degree within 6 years either from NMU or another institution.

This percentage goes up to 81% (n=13) for students receiving veteran's benefits, 70% (n=86) for Pell grant recipients, and 65% (n=24) for students of color.

• For the Fall 2012 Part-Time Transfer students, 54% (n=6) of them received a degree within 6 years either from NMU or another institution.

Notes:

The fall 2016 cohort includes 999 First-Time Full-Time students and 329 Full-Time Transfer students;

The fall 2012 cohort includes 11 Part-Time Transfer students.


















