Nominations:

Nomination from the home institution is required. The nominated student(s) will receive a link to the application and all supporting documents. The completed application must be submitted by the following deadlines:

Incoming students must have completed a minimum of two semesters at their home university. Applicants must meet NMU's English Language Proficiency requirement. Please see below for acceptable English test and minimum scores:

TOEFL: 61 iBT/173 CBT/500 PBT
IELTS: overall score of 6.0
ITEP: overall score of 3.7
Duolingo: overall score of 95

Course and Grading Information

All courses are delivered in English. A full-time course load is 12-16 credits; 12 credits is the minimum study load and 16 is the maximum.

NMU uses letter grades which are assigned a numerical value. Grade reports called transcripts, are not mailed to students at the end of each semester. Students can access their grades on the NMU website.

Students can request transcripts be sent to their home institution at the end of the semester or their time at NMU. These can be sent either electronically or by mail.

Housing



The Woods

The Woods consist of three residence halls, which has six buildings. All have four floors with a central corridor connecting them to the Northern Lights Dining Facility. There are classrooms, study spaces, and a 24/7 front desk in the facility.



The Dorms

The Dorms consist of 6 residence halls. Each hall is comprised of smaller communities, called houses, of about 45 students each. These houses share the hall identity, but have their own personalities, expectations, traditions, governments, and activities.



Apartment

The Apartments house more than 650 members of the campus community in its well-maintained apartments and townhouses. The on-campus apartments feature one, two, and four-bedroom units.

NOTE: To live in apartments, students must be 21 years or older or have completed at least 56 credits
