Transfer Guide for Northwestern Michigan College

Our fully online RN to BSN program allows licensed registered nurses with an associate degree to complete their BSN fully online in as little as four semesters. Our program includes 16 credits of nursing courses which will expand your nursing knowledge base to include enhanced skills for understanding and implementing evidence based practice, nursing policy, leadership, management, population and global health. This program will promote career advancement by expanding both the nursing and leadership skill sets.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Students must hold an active RN license free of restrictions and an associate degree from an accredited institution with a 2.5 overall GPA. NMU will accept up to ninety (90) credit hours of transfer credit.
