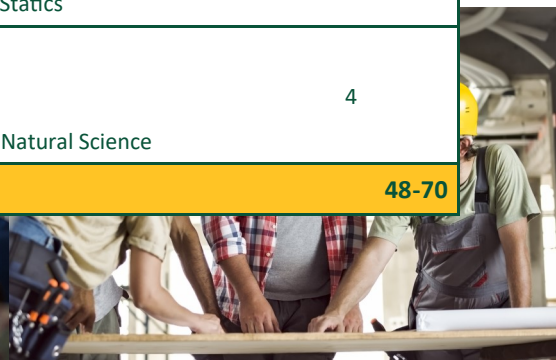
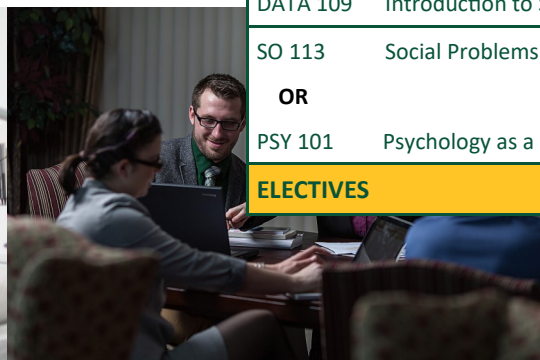
TIME WITH MID-STATE

Students may earn any associate degree from Mid-State Technical College (although not required) before enrolling in Applied Workplace Leadership courses at NMU and have the 12 credits of AWL Core Elective waived (see the required courses in the chart to the right).

In total, students may transfer up to ninety (90) credit hours. Unless otherwise designated, a grade of C– or higher is required for courses to be considered for transfer to NMU.
