The Criminal Justice Department provides students with an understanding of the process by which justice is distributed in our society, the function and operation of the criminal justice system (law enforcement, criminal courts, and corrections), and the role of individuals in the allocation of justice. The curriculum prepares students for a range of careers in law enforcement, adult and juvenile corrections with federal, state or local criminal justice agencies, or for graduate study. #### TIME WITH NICOLET COLLEGE

Students may earn any associate degree from Nicolet College (although not required) before enrolling in the criminal justice program online with NMU and may transfer up to ninety (90) credit hours. Unless otherwise designated, a grade of at least a C- is required for courses to be considered for transfer to NMU.

Students may also choose to concentrate in additional subject areas at Nicolet College in order to use those courses toward a minor (which is required for the Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice at NMU). A minimum of 4 credits in the minor must be completed at NMU.
