ANNOUNCEMENTS

TIMES – Northern Michigan University is located in the Eastern Time Zone.

MEALS – All meals listed in this schedule are included as part of the \$108.50 orientation room and board fee paid by participants who are staying in the residence halls during orientation. Those who are not staying on campus may purchase meals at the entrance of the dining hall.

ARRIVAL DAY

- Noon to 3:00 p.m. **ORIENTATION CHECK-IN & RESIDENCE HALL CHECK-IN** (The Woods, Lobby)
Check in anytime between 12 p.m. and 3 p.m. ET
- Noon to 3:00 p.m. **OUTDOOR WALK & TALK CAMPUS TOURS** (The Woods, Lodge) *Optional*
Tours will depart every 30 minutes beginning at 12:00 p.m. with the last tour departing at 2:00 p.m. All participants, including those who are staying off-campus during orientation, are highly encouraged to participate in a campus tour. The tours will conclude at the Wildcat Express Center (see ID card information below). **This is an extensive walking tour that lasts about an hour, rain or shine.**
- Noon to 3:00 p.m. **WILDCAT EXPRESS STUDENT ID CARDS** (Northern Center, 1227)
Students will pose for their NMU ID picture. The staff of the Wildcat Express Center will provide information on the multiple uses of the card. Additional information can be found in the student check-in folder. Students need to have their NMU IN (included in their folder at check-in) when they visit the Wildcat Express Center.

Our recreational facility will be open for all students and Guests to walk through and/or use, free of charge. Staff will be available to answer questions.

This the first opportunity to take the math placement exam. There will be another opportunity on Day 2 of orientation. Students were notified if their declared major requires a math placement score. Students who do not have any math credits transferring to NMU should check with their advisor to see if they need to take the math placement test. ****Please arrive promptly at the start time.**

This session will include a welcome, introduction of the orientation staff and the assignment of student participants to small groups.

Students will meet their orientation leader and learn what to expect from the upcoming sessions.

- 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. **ACADEMIC ADVISING PREPARATION** (Rooms announced at Small Group Meeting #1)
Students will learn to navigate NMU systems, including MyNMU, DegreeWorks, and ESP. They will also gain an understanding of the key components of their degree and graduation requirements by going through the NMU Catalog. A Success Advisor will lead this session.
- 5:30 p.m. to 6:45 p.m. **DINNER** (Northern Lights Dining)
All students and guests are welcome to attend.
- 7:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. **WELLBEING RESOURCES** (Jamrich Hall, 1100)
This session will provide information about campus resources that will help support all dimensions of your wellbeing (Career, Physical, Social, Spiritual, Emotional, Environmental, Financial, and Intellectual) as you juggle your new (and sometimes stressful) college responsibilities.

Math Placement (The Science Building, 2904): Students were notified if their declared major requires a math placement score. Students who do not have any math credits transferring to NMU should check with their advisor to see if they need to take the math placement test.
 **Please arrive promptly at the start time.
Nursing Chemistry Readiness Test (Jamrich, 1313): Students planning on applying to the Nursing program who do not have the appropriate college credit in Chemistry will need to take the Chemistry Readiness placement test to be appropriately placed into Chemistry courses.
Language Placement (Jamrich, 3102): This placement test is for students who are interested in taking a foreign language course at NMU. If you are not transferring college language credits but have taken a foreign language course prior to attending NMU, you should take the language placement test.
English Placement (Jamrich, 3103): Students with a high school GPA below 2.25 and no prior college English credit may take the English placement essay exam if they wish to test into EN 111: College Composition I rather than taking EN 109: Intensive College Composition. (Note: students who would like additional assistance with their writing can self-select into EN 109.)
