ANNOUNCEMENTS

TIMES – NMU is located in the Eastern Time Zone

ATTENDANCE- You are required to attend every session listed on your schedule. Exceptions include the Electronic Payment/Payment Plan Sign-up session (only if you need assistance) and Meeting for Residence Hall (only for students living on-campus).

MEALS- Meals are not included with Orientation on Wednesday, January 7th. **Students with a meal plan may use their ID card to purchase food starting on Thursday, January 8th.** Students (and guests) without a meal plan will be provided a meal ticket for both lunch and dinner on Thursday, January 8th.

WEDNESDAY

- 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. **ORIENTATION CHECK-IN** (Harden Hall, Lower Level)
Check in anytime between 12:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. At check-in, you will be provided instruction and given orientation materials for the program.
- 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. **LAPTOP DISTRIBUTION** (Harden Hall, 122)
Students will be issued a computer for the academic year. During this time, you will also set up the computer for use. ***You MUST register and set-up your laptop right away in order to have your laptop ready for the Math Placement Test.*** If you are not a full-time student, you may return the computer after the orientation program on Friday, or you may elect to keep the computer for the semester and be charged the TLC Laptop Fee. ***To be issued a laptop, your NMU Identification Number (located in student folder) and a Photo ID are required.***
- 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. **WILDCAT EXPRESS STUDENT ID CARDS** (Northern Center, 1227)
Students should pose for their ID card photos. ID cards are used for entrance to residence halls and dining locations. ***Students must take their NMU IN (located in student folders) to receive an ID card.***
- 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. **PLACEMENT TESTING** (Jamrich Hall), **Laptop Required for Testing**
Math Placement (Jamrich, 1320): NMU has a math graduation requirement. Students who do not have any math credits transferring to NMU must take the math placement test. Please note that placement tests from previous universities do not transfer with you.
Nursing Chemistry Readiness Test (Jamrich, 1311): Students planning on applying to the Nursing program who do not have the appropriate college credit in Chemistry will need to take the Chemistry Readiness placement test to be appropriately placed into Chemistry courses.
Language Placement (Jamrich, 1318): This placement test is for students who are interested in taking a foreign language course at NMU. If you are not transferring college language credits but have taken a foreign language course prior to attending NMU, you should take the language placement test.

10:05 a.m. to 10:55 a.m.	INVOLVEMENT OPPORTUNITIES (Jamrich Hall, 1100) A presentation on campus life, extracurricular activities and student organizations.
10:55 a.m. to 11:55 a.m.	WELLBEING, SAFETY & CONDUCT (Jamrich Hall, 1100) This session will provide information about campus resources that will help support your overall wellbeing as you juggle your new (and sometimes stressful) college environment. The WellBeing Department, Dean of Students Office and NMU Police Department will share vital information regarding student behavior and the university's expectations.

1:00 p.m. to 1:30 p.m.	FINANCIAL AID INFORMATION (Jamrich Hall, 1100) The Financial Aid Office provides students with the basic necessary information to manage their financial aid at NMU.
1:30 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.	LARGE GROUP MEETING (Jamrich Hall, 1100) Students will be given information on how to be successful at NMU and as a college student in general. Students will be split up into the appropriate rooms for the next session.
2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.	ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT & COURSE SCHEDULING (<i>Refer to advising sheet for room locations</i>) Students will work with academic advisers to finalize their schedule for the winter.
3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.	ELECTRONIC PAYMENT OF TUITION & FEES/PAYMENT PLAN SIGN UP – LAPTOP REQUIRED (Jamrich Hall, 1100) Once course registration has been completed, students may attend this session anytime between 3:30 and 5:00 p.m. Staff will walk students through the process of paying their bill and/or signing up for a payment plan online. Students who plan to pay their bill online will need either a check or credit card to do so.
