Nursing Chemistry Readiness Test (Jamrich, 1313) Students planning on applying to the Nursing program who do not have the appropriate college credit in Chemistry will need to take the Chemistry Readiness placement test to be appropriately placed into Chemistry courses.

English Placement (Jamrich, 3102) Students with a high school GPA below 2.25 & no prior college English credit may take the English placement essay exam if they wish to test into EN 111: College Composition I rather than taking EN 109: Intensive College Composition.


