 - v. Purchase Local Foods; support local farms

 - c. Small group discussion had the following ideas on how to promote sustainability on campus:

Discussion: What would encourage employee philanthropy during Giving Day at NMU or other fundraising campaigns?

- Identify specific projects
- Progress reports on the projects (giving thermometer)
- Identify prior successes, including testimonials (student testimonials)
- Giver should have opportunity to select project
- Make it easier to give can we go online to change our payroll giving?
- Departmental challenges (e.g., paying to wear jeans, positivity jar, coffee money)
- Department challenges (support vs. academic)
- Making sure that we see the student face on the gift
- Want to see student impact
- Dashboard that indicates % of goal met
- Specific projects don't have to be big (GoFundMe model), crowdfunding smaller projects
- Younger faculty don't have money, so give small amounts that are recognized as meaningful
- Increase percentage of giving to communicate how employees support NMU and students
