Advanced Standing Option





Students who have completed a BSW from a CSWE accredited program should apply for advanced standing.

Students admitted under Advanced Standing will complete the 36-credit program in one calendar year, or three semesters total, beginning in summer semester.

The summer semester will focus on consolidating entry-level social work competencies and linking them to the concentration curriculum beginning in fall semester. Beginning in fall semester, students will begin concentration courses in either Clinical or Advanced Generalist practice.

As with the second year of the Regular Standing program, students will specialize courses and field placements in their chosen area of concentration. Students should enter the advanced standing field placement prepared to work with a wide variety of settings and populations as generalist practitioners.

Beginning in fall semester, advanced standing students will begin a 500 hour field placement in their area of concentration.

The concentration field placement builds off generalist skills and knowledge, as well as the values and ethics of the profession, in order to develop more specialized skills and knowledge.

Field placements will be selected based on each student's concentration, unique interests and professional goals, and the agencies ability to provide practice opportunities.

Field Placement



Clinical Concentration

Clinical students will develop entry-level proficiency in therapeutic counseling skills, including mental health therapy and diagnostics, while continuing to exercise competencies gained in the first year of the program.

Students will work with the field coordinator to select a field placement in a particular area of clinical interest, including mental health with adults, children and families, and co-occuring disorders.
