NEWS FROM MARQUETTE

Renovations in our future

The newest capital outlay project on campus is the renovation of the Jacobetti Complex. There was quite a bit of discussion involving a new building, but the \$28.6M could not support the new programming area. Our faculty team is ecstatic about the renovation, as our lab areas will remain largely untouched. The new building would have cut about 70% of the square footage from our lab areas. Miron was selected as the Construction Manager, and is working with Neumann Smith during the preconstruction.

The progress status is "pending" as our submittal to the State of Michigan, seeking approval to move beyond schematic design, requires legislative approval. We hope to have some more substantial updates for the summer newsletter

David Prado (Huffman, TX) is pursuing opportunities in Texas.



ADDISON, IL





- Mike will be attending the Michigan Construction Career Days in Howell, MI, in May.


