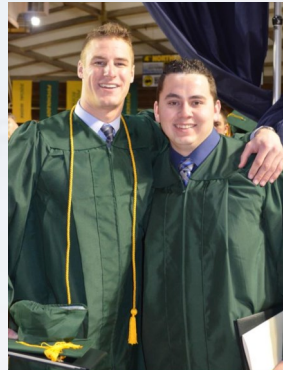

1st Ever Alumni Spotlight

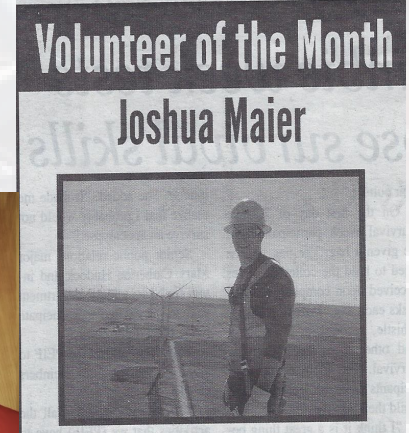
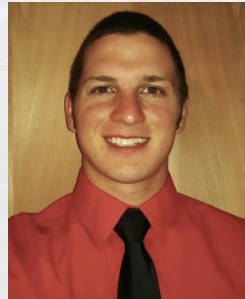

NMU's Northwind Volunteer of the Month

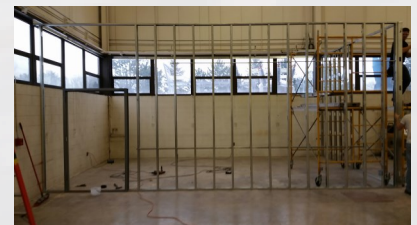
