ADDITIONAL STEPS TO ENTER THE SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM

- Earn a 2.50 GPA in the social work major and cluster minor at the time of application to the upper level curriculum
- Pass SW 100 and SW 230 prior to admission to the upper level curriculum
- Five of the seven clusters in the Human Behavior Cluster must have been completed at time of application
- A written personal statement
