- ☐ Cumulative GPA of 3.0 prior to starting at NMU is required for the Methods Phase.
- ☐ For the purposes of this agreement, PHS 100, EDU 220, and MTH 148 will transfer as EDU 1009 and satisfy the 9 credit transfer deficiency in the major.
